PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE...

Since our last newsletter, we have had two very well attended General Meetings. In December, we had our annual Christmas/Holiday Party at which we were entertained with seasonal songs by the Harmony Singers and enjoyed tasty treats supplied by the Badminton Group. During the evening, raffle tickets were sold for the prizes donated by our Interest Groups: there were some wonderful prizes from which to choose. That evening we raised \$1816 - this is the most we have ever raised at this event. The money was donated to each of Women's Habitat and Ernestine's Women's Shelter- each of which received \$908 to help the women and their children over the holiday season.

At our January meeting, our speaker was one of our own members – Elaine Hamilton, who has travelled extensively. Her talk to us during this evening was a description and photographic presentation about her trip with National Geographic through the Mid-Atlantic Ridge and the isolated island communities that exist along that ridge. These islands are actually the tops of the massive Mid-Atlantic underwater mountain range. Thanks to Elaine for such an entertaining and educational presentation.



In December, another Club member, Angela Capobianco, made a generous donation to our Club that we, in turn, donated to The Charitable Trust. Angela has had a jewellery business and she held a sale in her home especially for our members. She donated half of the money made during that sale to our Club: the sale resulted in a donation of \$595 - thanks to Angela and those members who purchased some of her beautiful jewellery.

On February 23, CFUW Etobicoke will be one of the participants at the annual Government and Community Services Fair held at Cloverdale Mall. This event is sponsored by Donna Cansfield and Laurel Broton and is an opportunity for notfor-profit organizations and services to promote themselves and provide information to anyone interested. ENERGY PROGRAM FOR YOUR HOME


"Helping those in need with no-cost energy upgrades"

As part of the Health Centre's Patient, Family and Community engagement strategy, the Women's Population Panel provides a unique forum for dialogue


among Health Centre staff, community agency representatives and health care consumers, all focused on enhancing women centered care in this community.
