The solar lamp provides economical and safe light, allowing a woman or girl to study at night, move in the dark, prepare meals or care for a family member in their shelter.

The Little Sun Project is an example of how a small thing can make a big difference to the lives of women and girls. It is an affordable charitable gift with a huge impact.
