In June of 2019 - *four* years ago - the government of Canada officially recognized the importance of Indigenous languages by passing the Indigenous Languages Act. There are more than 70 distinct Indigenous languages within 12 language families in Canada. The Act dedicates sustained funding by the Canadian government for the revitalization, preservation, maintenance and strengthening all of the Indigenous languages in Canada. Our CFUW Mission Statement commits us to strive to promote equality and social justice and lifelong learning. We are all committed to increasing our knowledge about Indigenous languages and their cultural importance.
