There is a disproportionate number of women who are victims and it is important to engage men and boys in addressing this issue. We know that "shame and blame" is not the answer. Domestic violence is preventable.

In many Indigenous cultures on Turtle Island, Moose Hide is considered medicine. The pins, which you have been given, are like medicine for a social ailment in our society. When you wear a Moose Hide pin, it becomes a cause for discussion. You are telling others of the goal to end gender based violence. Together we are making a change.
